Singer brings new sound, guitar to Eddie's Attic

Look out, Georgia - Claire Holley has a new guitar.

Most singer/songwriters have several guitars at their disposal, all of which serve different purposes and make different sounds. Holley, however, has been working with the same guitar since she dedicated her life to music in 1990.

Now that her fourth album, "Dandelion," has been released on Yep Roc Records, Holley decided it was time to trade in old faithful for something anew.

"I've played it to death," she explains from her home in North Carolina, sipping a beer to celebrate her purchase. "I just wanted something a little more reliable.

"When I found this one, I just felt it."

Holley will bring her new strings to Eddie's Attic on Wednesday as part of her tour to support "Dandelion," a project on which Holley says she tried to steer away from the familiar.

She says she wanted to make a more "organic-sounding record," so she enlisted the help of producer Steve Graham. He encouraged her to "bring out the edge and sass and attitude" through the use of a strong rhythm section, but still wanted to preserve the vocals and acoustic guitar.

"I wanted a live vibe to it," Holley says. "A lot of the records that I like are ones where you can kind of tell there's an energy to the room. I don't think you can fabricate that."

Holley worked with guitarist Rob Seals, percussionists Nic Brown and Eddie Walker, vocalist Danielle Howle and Atlanta guitarist Justin Rosolino to record the songs, which she wrote over a two-year period.

The result is an album filled with music that reflects the emotions expressed in the lyrics. On "Love Never Came," Holley's forlorn vocals cry, "You were blind and then you could see, but love never came to me, love never came," as the drums and dobro swell around her.

"We all came together and just started play-

ing ... I would say it was a very collaborative record," she says.

The opening track, "6 Miles to McKenney," is Holley's favorite song to play. The story of a wild-looking woman who pulls up to a truck stop usually elicits laughter.

"I have been trying to write a song like that for a while, that on a very simple level gets people's attention," Holley says. "It's just fun to rock out when so many of my songs are so mellow. When I'm at my best, I think those songs are pretty. But sometimes you want to get your blood moving."

Rocking at Eddie's will be a perfect chance to break in the new guitar.

"The audience almost always seems to be for you," she says of the Decatur venue. "They're usually pretty forgiving, and they seem to be there to listen to music.

"I've got a new guitar, so hopefully I'll be able to stay in tune.'
